His goals and objectives were:

- To **preserve and cherish** all sources and records of the ancient traditions, Na Oli A Me Na Mele, traditional and historic sites of Hawai'i Nei.
- To **protect** the endemic and indigenous flora and fauna of this land, and to actively encourage the teaching, learning and use of olelo makuahine' and...
- To **actively encourage** and assist furthering education of persons of Hawaiian ancestry.

As presented Prince Jonah Kuhio's legacy to all of us is that all civic club members must focus on issues that impact the Hawaiian community in our relationships with others and our people, our involvement in government, the environment, traditions, music, the aina, and education, to name a few.

I want to make a commitment to all of you that your officers and board of directors will work very hard to carry out the legacy.

My theme for this next year is "Leadership, Education and Outreach." I want to develop future leaders, educate our members on Hawaiian issues and concerns and to partner with other Hawaiian organizations that impact the Hawaiian people and their communities.
