Akaka Bill: Members are urged to keep abreast of the Akaka Bill by accessing the following websites: www.oha.org and www.nativehawaiians.com.

Kau Inoa: Today, the establishment of a new Native Hawaiian government is on the horizon and can be achieved with the will and support of the Hawaiian people. As the indigenous people of Hawai'i, Native Hawaiians have an inherent human right to self-determination and self-governance. To form a new government, a list must first be compiled of those who want to participate in the formation or establishment of

the government. Thus, a Native Hawaiian community working group and OHA have created an enrollment form called "Kau Inoa", The Native Hawaiian Registration Form. To obtain a registration form, call Hawai'i Maoli at 394-0050. The information will be collected and maintained by Hawaii Maoli, an independent, non-governmental repository.
