SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE



The committee is near completing the awards to our scholarship recipients for the 2005-06 school year. HCCH

will be making an award to 48 applicants this year totaling \$37.648 (13 graduate applicants, 34 undergraduates and one medical student). The applicants were asked to write an essay on the "Leaseto-Fee Conversion" issue as part of the application process. By the May 31st post-marked deadline, the committee received 61 applications. After processing the applications, 13 applicants were disqualified for (1) lack of receiving a current school transcript; (2) failure to meet the required grade point average; or (3) lack of or poorly written essay. Of the 48 applicants we are making an award to this year, 28 are new applicants and 20 are returning applicants. The committee is working on sending out the award checks by mid-August. The mailing of the awards will conclude the scholarship process for 2005. The application process for the 2006 will reopen on March 1, 2006. 


