National Indian Education Association Revitalizing Native Language Research Scholarship ***DEADLINE EXTENDED***

The NIEA and Professor Lily Wong Fillmore solicits application for graduate student research on revitalizing Native language research.

(\$1,000 for one academic school year)

Scholarship Criteria & Guidelines:

- * Graduate student-researcher must be American Indian, Alaska Native or Native Hawaiian
- * Student must be engaged in the documentation or study of a language revitalization effort in an indigenous community or in a school serving indigenous students
- * Enrolled full-time in an accredited college/university master's or doctorate program that incorporates studying the revitalization of an indigenous language.

- * Demonstrate leadership qualities
 - * Maintain high academic achievement
 - * Serve as a role model for other students *
- Demonstrate creativity in commitments in the following areas:

- Promote an understanding and appreciation for native language revitalization
- Demonstrate positive, active student leadership within the school or indigenous community they are serving
- Demonstrate and/or encourage peer student and indigenous community involvement in revitalizing indigenous languages

2008 MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. NATIONAL HOLIDAY UPDATE

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Coalition-Hawai'i will be holding its annual parade in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr on September 21, 2007. The Hawai'i Pono'i Coalition plans to participate in the parade for a couple reasons, among which are to honor Dr. King, U.S. Civil Rights leader and clergyman and to begin partnerships with non-Hawaiian > organizations who support our quest for self-determination. The coalition respects the struggles and advancements of Black Americans. In common with Black Americans is social justice. Native Hawaiians, the indigenous people of Hawai'i, seek justice to have their sovereign nation restored.

Accordingly, all civic clubs are invited to participate in the parade. If you wish to join in, simply fill out the parade application that can be found at the website indicated below. Flow of the Hawaiian organizations in the parade will likely be the Hawaii Pono'i Coalition banner, followed by various Hawaiian organizations that have chosen to participate.

The Coalition also plans to have an educational booth at Kapiolani Park.

The Hawa'i Pono'i Coalition was formed to educate those who live in and visit the Islands about Hawai'i's true history, the Native Hawaiian people, and the culture that makes Hawai'i a place like no other. Among those listed as members of the coalition are Kamakakuokalani, Kamehameha Schools, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, Alu Like Inc., the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs, the Friends of 'Iolani Palace, the King William Charles Lunalilo Trust, the Queen Lili'uokalani Trust and Learning Center, the Queen Emma Foundation, the Native Hawaiian Legal Corp., 'Ilio'uokalani Coalition, Na Pua A Ke Ali'i Pauahi, Inc., Native Hawaiian Legal Corp, Pa'i Foundation, Queen Lili'uokalani Trust and Children's Centers, and Native Hawaiian Hospitality Association.
