**OHA invites you to a OHA Legislation Package Community Outreach Presentation**

As part of its mandate to advocate for Native Hawaiians, OHA submits a package of proposed bills to the Hawai'i State Legislature every year. Five bills are being introduced which may be of interest to Hawaiian Civic Clubs. 1. HB1781/SB2192: This bill will ensure more consideration of Native Hawaiian rights, knowledge, values, and practices in state decision making for lands critical to Native Hawaiian culture and well-being.
2. HB1782/SB2193: This measure seeks to improve the potential for people who have old convictions on their record to obtain and keep legitimate employment, thereby supporting their rehabilitation and continued law-abiding conduct over the long-term.
3. HB1783/SB2194: This bill establishes and enhances enforcement mechanisms to meaningfully deter violations of state historic preservation laws and better protect culturally invaluable historic sites and burials.
4. HCR5/SCR3 This resolution urges DLNR and its State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD) to engage in long-awaited and much needed administrative rulemaking that will better protect iwi kūpuna and cultural sites in the state historic preservation review process.
5. HB1784/SB2195 This measure reinforces Native Hawaiian constitutional rights by encouraging landowners to accommodate cultural practitioners' access to their lands.
6. HB1780/SB2191 This bill appropriates \$3 million for the construction of a water storage and distribution system on agricultural lands owned by OHA in Wahiawā, O'ahu.
